



Mayor's Message

Dear Neighbors,

First of all, I want to thank you again for placing your trust in me. It is truly an honor and privilege to serve as your Mayor. It has been a very busy first three months. I hit the ground running and began working with the entire Council, our residents, our borough professionals and countless volunteers to ensure that Demarest continues to be a wonderful place to live.

We hired a new Borough Administrator, Julie Falkenstern, who is doing an excellent job! We made critical changes to the Finance Office and hired a new interim CFO, Cameron Keng, and finance assistant, Peter Suh. We said good-bye to Jim Powderly, our former Borough Administrator, our Interim Acting Borough Clerk, and a Finance Clerk. I wish them all well and success in the future.

We are making long-overdue changes to our finance software and payroll service to better serve the Borough and its employees. These changes will create better accountability and needed efficiency.

We have rolled up our sleeves and started to work on the many issues I highlighted at our Council Reorganization meeting in January. Demarest's financial health and taxes remain a priority, and to be honest, some of what has been discovered in the these beginning few months is disconcerting, revealing long standing issues. This presents significant economic challenges for the Borough. Some of those challenges include rectifying inappropriate spending, bills left unpaid, indefensible use of the Borough's Fund Balance, mismanagement and lack of financial planning. Our debt servicing is a significant part of the budget and needs better management and oversight. Police and Fire safety equipment were allowed to exceed their useful lives without planning for replacement. However, we are working with our financial professionals and staff to develop a budget that provides the best services to our residents, addresses the issues we found and makes certain that we invest in our infrastructure and our future while also managing rising costs. Accounting for mistakes of the past is an unfortunate reality, but we are employing a common sense approach to navigate a better path forward. Flood management, affordable housing, our Borough Hall and bank building, and our closed leaf compost yard are just a few of the issues that we are addressing. The budget will be presented to the public as soon as feasible; but remember, we inherited problems that cannot be resolved in a single budget year and will need to be addressed with a multiyear plan.





As promised, we have returned to twice a month Mayor and Council meetings so that we have more opportunities to come together as a group to discuss the issues that face our town and are able to make informed decisions and offer the public an opportunity to participate. Agendas and minutes are posted at demarestnj.gov under the tab labeled government.

Since January, I have had Mayor's office hours on Mondays. Going forward I will generally be available 10-4 on Mondays. Please feel free to call the Borough Administrator to check to make sure I am available or make an appointment at another time. You can also stop by and see if I am available. I have already met with many residents.

The Borough Administrator and I spoke with our trash / recycling contractor, IWS, and were able to arrange for a few extra pickups for the months that have 5 weeks, and our normal schedule would have precluded a recycling pick up on the 5th Wednesday for the balance of 2023, without additional cost. The first extra pickup was March 29, 2023 and I'm pleased to report that over 5 tons of paper and cardboard were picked up, so the day was a success! Please mark your calendars for the additional days for the extra paper/cardboard pick up on May 31, August 30 and November 29. Please make sure you put these items at the curb the night before so you don't miss the early morning pickup!



Department Updates & Borough Services

Fire Department

The Demarest Fire Department is once again having a record-setting year for calls. We have responded to numerous alarms in town and continue to work with our neighboring towns receiving and providing mutual aid. We continue to look for new members! We are reaching out to anyone interested in joining our great department and serving our residents. Another way to help is to contribute to our annual fund drive. The Mayor and Council support us by funding state-of-the-art equipment to keep us all safe. We apply for grants every year to offset costs to the taxpayers. Over the past 5 years, we applied for and received close to \$500,000.00 in grant funds for equipment and retention programs.

Never hesitate to call 911 when your alarms activate!! Please don't ever think you are "inconveniencing" us by having us respond to your house, it's what we do, and we love doing it! Be sure to check your smoke/CO alarm batteries, and always be sure any lithium batteries that you may purchase are UL certified! Most fires started by these batteries are from used/rebuilt/cheaper batteries.

Police Department

The Demarest Police Department is proud to welcome two new officers who graduated from the police academy in December. We are confident they will serve our residents with professionalism, pride, and distinction.

Officer Connor Owens grew up in Westwood and graduated from William Paterson University where he received his Bachelor's Degree in Marketing with a minor in Economics. In January 2022, Officer Owens became a Special Police Officer Class 1 with the Demarest Police Department, where he was recognized with two Life Saving Awards for his actions in saving the lives of two people.

Officer Andrew Anavim grew up in and has been a Demarest resident his entire life. He graduated with a bachelor's degree from the University at Albany in Emergency Preparedness and Homeland Security and is currently in the process of receiving his master's degree in criminal justice. He graduated from the Bergen County Police Academy earning the Top Gun award in his class.





Bicycle Helmets; Please remind your children that in New Jersey, anyone under 17 years of age that rides a bicycle, is a passenger on a bicycle or is towed as a passenger by a bicycle must wear a safety helmet.

Walking Dogs without a Leash Please remember Ordinance 89-1: No person owning, harboring, keeping, walking or protecting any dog, whether licensed or unlicensed, shall permit said dog to run at large or unleashed off the premises owned, leased, rented or occupied by such person within the territorial limits of the borough.

9 PM Routine Adopt the 9 PM Routine: Check your vehicles each night by 9 PM; ensure your vehicle is safe and secure and that key fobs and valuables have been removed.

Emergency Alerts and Notifications: The Demarest Police Department and the Demarest Office of Emergency Management use two different companies to communicate emergency alerts to the residents. Nixle sends a text message and email to residents, and Swiftreach sends a recorded voice message to landlines. If you would like to receive alerts and advisories from the Demarest Police Department, Text 07627 to 888-777 to opt in to Nixle. To make sure you are receiving landline messages from Swiftreach, please sign up on the Police Department website and click on the Swiftreach graphic to enter the portal.

Child Seat Installations: In many instances, parents and caregivers do not install child seats correctly. Child Passenger Safety Technicians (CPSTs) are trained to assist with the installation and ensure the safety of these child seats. The Demarest Police Department has assigned Police Officer Del Greco as the Child Passenger Safety Technician. Officer Del Greco can assist Demarest Borough residents who would like help with the installation or inspection of a child seat. 

Planning Board

The Planning Board recently approved the site plan proposed by United Way to construct a 17-unit 100% affordable housing project on Borough-owned property at 127 Hardenburgh Avenue. The project will include supportive housing for persons with disabilities as well as housing for seniors and families and will fulfill the Borough's current affordable housing obligation. The Board also recently completed a periodic review of the Master Plan and will be working on recommended updates.

Zoning Board of Adjustment

The Zoning Board of Adjustment continues to receive a steady flow of applications, which in recent years have been mainly related to improved lot and building coverage issues. In January, two regular members and one alternate were reappointed to the Board, and one new alternate was appointed to fill an unexpired one-year term.


Shade Tree Commission

Summer is almost here; come join The Demarest Swim Club!


